Dear Pastor and Church Family,

These past two months, we started an outreach specifically to the University in our area. Collectively, we have given out around four thousand Gospel tracts since March. We have had several people ask questions while we are out passing out tracts. One day, I had an interesting conversation with a very prominent Muslim that is enrolled in the University. He is getting his degree in Religious Education. He was interested in talking at length, and we got into a very healthy discussion about the Gospel. When we were finished talking, he admitted that it was the first time that he had ever hear the Gospel explained to him that way before. I have had three other students contact me after reading the Gospel tract. We are continuing to hold Bible studies with two of them on Saturdays. One of the young men even came to our Easter Monday church fellowship that we attend at Biblical Baptist Church, our sister church in Kumasi. We are excited to see how the Lord will bless this ministry.

Recently, Jane, our third child, and I were visiting around the church. I customarily greeted a man as he was walking by. I was a little surprised when he turned around and came to sit down to talk with us. He had a lot of questions about Eternal Life. He was really confused about if salvation could really be forever. After showing him numerous verses from God's Word, he shook his head and said that he thinks he has been lied to. He told me that he is a Methodist Sunday School teacher at one of the largest churches in our area. He said he was ashamed that he has been teaching people the Bible, but he was not even sure if he would go to Heaven or not. We talked over a couple of hours. I have contacted him three times since, but he is not willing to study together anymore, as of now. This happens numerous times as we work for the Lord here. People hear and then understand the Truth, but sadly, many will not accept it because of what they will lose if they do.



Our church had two baptisms on Resurrection Sunday. It was so wonderful to baptize them. The young man I baptized was the one I have written about previously that grew up with a Muslim uncle, and he too was a Muslim when I met him. He has been very dedicated to the church services. Since he is an elementary school teacher, he has even been teaching some of the Bible classes for the school, using our church's Abeka Bible flashcards as his curriculum.
